

2009 Wagon Train Rules

1. A current negative coggins must be presented upon arrival at the gate before entering the campground.
2. Any horse bought off of the market less than 30 days prior to the wagon train will be turned away.
3. Per forestry regulations, when camping in the national forest, no horse should be tied to trees, but only on a tie line.
4. The wagon train will not be responsible for anything lost or damaged.
5. Children are playing in the campground, so please be very careful when driving through.
6. Pull out times will be set the night before. Pull out time will generally be around 9:00 am to 9:30 am, but no later than 10:00 am. Everyone should be ready to leave at the set time. If not ready, you will be asked to catch up or stay at the camp.
7. All children under the age of 18 needs to be at their camp site by 10:30 pm each night. Every child is to be under adult supervision. Please do not bring your child to ride and expect someone else to be responsible for them.
8. No foul language, alcohol, or drugs are permitted on the campground.
9. No fighting will be tolerated. If a fight does happen, the law will be called.
10. Firearms or any other weapons will not be permitted on the campground.
11. When leaving the campground, all riders will be asked to stay behind the 1st wagon. At this point, only the flaggers should be in the road. No one should be riding up & down the road before the wagons pull out.
12. All riders shall ride 2 abreast behind a wagon. No one is allowed in front of the front flagger or behind the rear flagger.
13. Once the wagon train pulls out on the road, horseback riders will not be allowed to pass the wagons just to be going back and forth in the train. This can upset the teams that are pulling the wagons.
14. Stud horses shall be under control at all times. If staying at the campground, he will be hobbled and double-tied or kept on a trailer. If the horse causes trouble, the owner will be asked to remove the stud from the campground.
15. All horses are to be kept under control at all times. When the wagon train is on the road, please keep in mind that we want to keep everyone safe. May God bless each and every one of us.
